PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Another busy year for the WA Squash Board, Staff Members and Volunteers.

Please see summary of key events in 2019.

Facilities:

WA Squash continued to work on the business case study with the State Government and consultants to identify what is required for a new State Squash Centre facility, estimated budget and location.

This has been a detailed process and we are very thankful to the Government for the opportunity.

The matter is still with the Government and no further news at this point in time.

Investment Property, Westminster:

WA Squash took the decision to sell the property at Westminster. The primary reason was to assist with cash flow and materialise the building fund reserve.

Club Junior Programs:

We have seen a significant increase in Club junior participation in several of our Clubs. This has been the result of a more direct allocation of Heathway's funding, strong support from local Clubs and professional Coaching to administrate the new players. Very pleasing results.

State Junior Team:

Decision was made to not send a team to the AJC this year, mixed opinions on this understandably. One of the main concerns is many States are unable to send full teams, which results in some players not having many matches.

The team went to Singapore instead, from all accounts this was a successful tour as all players had multiple matches against different opponents.

WA Squash will endeavour to work with Squash Australia and the other States on improving the AJC so the National Competition for Juniors can be a successful event.

Coaching and Referees:

Both committees are active and will form an important part of the WA Squash Strategic plan. Education is a critical component of sustaining and facilitating growth in Squash, we will be looking at how both the Coaching and Referee components can meet the current demand of Squash players.

During 2019 we had two coaching courses which will see approx. 20 new coaches into the system as well as we had one new referee complete the course .Well done!!

Squash Australia:

WA Squash continue to work with Squash Australia to seek the best outcome for our Members. Squash Australia along with the States have been working through Service Level Agreements which outline the specific items Squash Australia will be delivering and the cost to deliver this.



Country:

Broome Squash club had a terrific year with not only hosting a wonderful Broome Invitational tournament with the great Sarah Fitz-Gerald playing in it (and she won it) but also winning the coveted Best Sports Club in Broome ...a fantastic effort by all . Esperance , Kalgoorlie , Moora , Dampier ,Busselton, Bunbury ,Manjimup ,Mandurah and Geraldton all held very successful events which are on again this year .

Competition:

Competition patterns of players continue to change, and our collective goal is to assist Clubs with providing competition events and activities that meet the current demand. Promoting participation for all level of players and ages will be the goal of the Competition / Pennant Committee.

Strategic Plan:

WA Squash will be presenting a Draft Strategic Plan at the 2020 AGM, this will outline and identify all aspects of Squash and the Plan to move our sport forward. We will be working closely with the Clubs on gaining their feedback and comment before implementing.

In summary I am pleased to report WA Squash is now on a strong financial footing and can now look forward to focusing on working closely with Clubs to meet their needs.

Would like to thank WA Squash Staff Dean Williams, Sue Hillier and Leonie Cole for their efforts this year and my fellow volunteer Board members who have been both active and a pleasure to work with.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The year started chaotically with a rushed move from the Terrace Squash Centre over the Xmas period where we moved into our office suite in Westminster and stored a lot of memorabilia in a store room in South Perth. Huge thanks to the many helpers and to Kane and Simmo for their ute to transport all the gear.

With Don Huffer resigning on the 31st of Jan and coping with a new software system for players, WA Squash had a lot to contend with.

During the year there were many highlights from my point of view .Many volunteers stepped up and helped enormously , The Board were very active and the staff at WA Squash showed great patience as we settled in at 15/386 Wanneroo Road , Westminster .

The various committees were meeting regularly with great input into fixing many things we needed to give attention to. It was decided early that WA would not participate at the AJC and instead go to Singapore in Dec.

The AGM in March saw 3 new Board members elected which evened up our numbers to be 4 male and 4 female, much to the delight of the DSR. The ensuing months sadly saw our relationship with Squash Aust (S.A.) deteriorate somewhat as we felt very strongly that WA just were not getting very good value for money from our affiliation fees. Other States came on board and this led to a spill of the President of S.A. in Nov. We wish the new President, Jo Brodie, all the best.

Our annual Volunteers night was held at Mirrabooka and with over 95 people attending it was a great night .We inducted 3 new Life Members: The Late Norm Collins, Ray Smith and Ed Jennings. Norm was President of WA Squash for 9 years and involved in the sixties and seventies in many ways and was a giant in the world of Squash .It was lovely that Lorraine Meuleman could attend and accept this award on behalf or her late Dad. Ed and Ray have been involved for over 20 years in various roles, both had stints as President of WA Squash, they were both Board members, Country council, Masters, juniors and it was fitting to honour these wonderful men their awards.

On the finances side WA Squash were hoping to sell the office suite in Westminster as without a tenant and a hefty mortgage to pay, our finances were stretched somewhat if we didn't sell it .We sold the suite in July and with a lease back deal we are able to still stay in the 3 offices we were occupying until July 2021.

Affiliated number across the state were up slightly which was great but I am confident that 2020 and 2021 will be good years for growth in squash and also for WA Squash as we continue to have a wonderful relationship with The DSR and State Government .

Thank you to everyone in helping me as it was certainly a challenging year and I look forward to continuing and communicating with the wonderful clubs we have in this State.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

D.L.G.S.C.I. Organisational Sustainability Funding

Fundamental to the workings of WA Squash is the \$65,000, Organisational Sustainability Funding we receive from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries. The D.L.G.S. C.I. also provide a great deal of additional assistance in various aspects of our operations. During the year they have been of considerable assistance in helping WA Squash address our long term premises situation. A big thankyou to Cameron Agnew for all his help throughout a difficult 2019

Healthway Health Promotion Funding

During 2019 we were again able to secure \$35,000 sponsorship from Healthway to promote the Smarter than Smoking message to as many squash participants as possible. Largely through the efforts of Tim Cowell, Josh Fiorentino, Sean Brockman, Lindsay Crane, Lynn Marsh, Josh Blakey, Callum Blakey, Sanny Ang, Sue Hillier and Isabella Diver we were able to reach over 7,000 students through our school programs (Just-Squash It, Mini Squash and Inflatable Courts).

Volunteers

WA Squash relies heavily on a large contingent of volunteers who provide support at the various stages of our programs. We are very appreciative of such involvement and encourage our Clubs to give recognition to all of those people who assist in any way. Highlighted by our Volunteers Function held at Mirrabooka in October where over 90 attended.

Sub-Committees

Our various sub-committees play a major role in assessing and controlling various elements of our sport through a more specific approach to their various field of interest. We thank all those people who make the time and effort to be involved.

Coaches

We are very appreciative of the coaches who are able to conduct various development sessions throughout the State. Such sessions are vital in instilling a desire for a participant to become more involved in the squash and help to ensure the future of the sport in this State.

Members

WA Squash is a representative body of the various affiliated Squash Clubs throughout the State of Western Australia (38 such Clubs at present). These member clubs together with Squash court owners and operators are the driving forces behind our sport.

MASTERS COMMITTEE REPORT

First of I would like to thank your committee, Terry Brooks, Ed Jennings, Chris Farley, Sharon Gilgallon, Ray Bell and Graham Follington. As well Greg Mills looked after the web site for us and Janis Haswell did a great job looking after our contributions to the Swan newsletter among other social media contributions.

The opening event of the year was the Battle of Belmont having moved because of the closure of Terrace Squash. Vic and Rhonda went to a lot of trouble to have the centre in tip top condition and the around sixty players that participated had a good night. The South West event normally held in Busselton was moved to Bunbury because of the uncertainty over the Busselton courts. This meant a larger number of entries from Bunbury and they ended up winning Division one again. The rest of the four division winners and runners up were from a wide range of centres both country and metro. Congratulations to Busselton for running an event away from home and thanks to Bunbury for providing a venue and a heap of support. It was a fun filled weekend with a great social event on the Saturday night.

The next couple of events were the Hilton Masters, (36 entries) and the State Championships (83 entries) and the Master / Junior event at Wangara. These attracted good numbers and were enjoyable events. The State Championships were played at Belmont and were very generously sponsored by National Tools as Naming rights sponsor. Hopefully this is an association we can continue in the coming years.

For the Australian Masters in Gold Coast in September we had 21 players in the individual events and three winners. Anne Richards won the Women's 65+, Sue Hillier won the Women's 55+ and Chas Renner won the Men's 90+. We had 17 teams competing in the second week and had our best results in a number of years winning 4 of the 21 divisions and runner up in another 3. Next year will be in Adelaide with the date moving to early October to accommodate those who wish to go to the World Masters Championships in Poland at the end of August.

The mid-year social event was held at the Grosvenor Hotel in the Perth CBD with about 40 people attending. Increasingly we are having to book for a set number and it becomes difficult to change this. If you want to attend you need to get in early so we can push the numbers up before the final confirmation date. That way you won't be disappointed. We have booked the end of year function at the Balmoral Hotel in Vic Park on Sunday 8th December starting at 12:30.

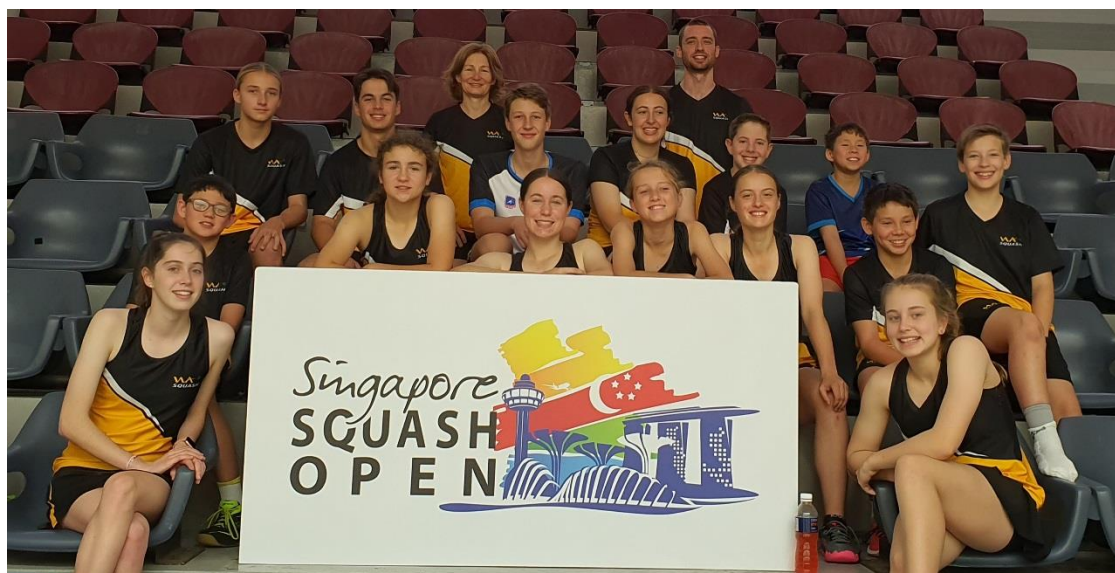
