

It's official - WA Squash has a new home!!! The Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSCI) have finalised the purchase of Belmont Squash Centre and the lease has been signed.

After three long years in the making —

WA Squash now has a state centre we can call home!





Thank you DLGSCI for their ongoing support in making this happen. Their belief in squash and the WA Squash community has grown from strength to strength over the years, and we could not ask for better partners to work with on our journey to rebuild our game.

As with all new homes, we too want to make it 'ours' by adding a fresh lick of paint, carpets, some internal re-decorating, lighting and if the budget allows, bathroom renovations. We'll do our best to work through this whilst keeping the centre open with as little disruption as possible. Don't forget that the Belmont centre is now open for court hire from 9am until late Monday to Friday and from 9.30am to 2pm Saturday and Sunday.

Speaking of renovations, WA Squash has spent a fair amount of time refreshing and updating the website http://www.wasquash.com.au/. While there is a lot more to do, there is now a gallery of scrolling images across the top, an interactive map to help find your nearest club, the ability to nominate for any league season via a webform, and more. Take a few minutes to have a look around if you can.

You may have noticed the increase in our social media presence, which will ensure everyone is kept in the loop about what's going down and what's coming up. Posts are published on the website's home page and then automatically pushed through to our Facebook page. It would be fantastic if you could follow us on Facebook if you don't already, and 'like' and 'share' our posts as much as possible. Let's work together to build the profile and following of Squash.

... and introducing the new squash promo flyer 'Get Into Squash' (see next page), which has been produced via a consultative process to target both juniors and adults across WA. The flyers will be given to all school kids who participate in our Inflatable Courts program however, we're more than happy to send some to those who would like to assist in spreading the word. WA Squash has sent (and will resend) the flyer to all centre operators and club contacts to put on their notice boards, community centre/shopping centre notice boards, Facebook pages and more.

The QR codes on the flyer direct all new and interested players on how to give squash a go.

When the Juniors QR code is scanned it takes you to a landing page on the website where all junior programs across the State are listed, and the Adult QR code to a list of all clubs across the State. In conjunction with the website's easy-to-use interactive map, everyone will be able to find

INDIVIDUALS

The annual WA State Junior Championships kicked off at the start of the school holidays at Belmont Saints Squash Centre. 54 mad-keen squash juniors entered this event, with players coming from Broome, Karratha, Moora, Esperance, Narrogin and even NSW for the most prestigious junior squash tournament run in WA. There were a variety of draws with some a round robin and some Swiss draws to enable players to at least have 2 if not 3 matches minimum.

In our premier event, World Junior Championships Team Members, Hannah Slyth and Dylan Classen reigned supreme over their opponents. Both U19 events were Round Robins with both Hannah and Dylan displaying their dominance by finishing at the top of their respective draws. Dylan and Hannah, along with Erin, Greg and Oscar will be heading off to Nancy on August 7 to represent Australia at the World Junior Championships.

Daniel Marsh played true to his seeding in the U17 boys division, topping his pool to be crowned the champion. Esperance's Aidan Finlay-Mulligan finished runner up. A special note to the Aidan vs Aiden match - a well fought battle that went to five. The speed and determination of both players attracted a large audience to this fine display of squash. In the U17 girls final, Hannah Slyth and Isla Harris had a nail-biting 5-setter, with Hannah claiming the W. Both excelled at backhand rallies and tricky shots that sent their opponent the wrong way.

In the U15 Boys, the longest match of the tournament occurred in the semis with the first game between Eric Marsh and NSW's Kieran Willathgamuwa going 19-21. For the final, Aiden Finlay-Mulligan defeated Eric Marsh in four games. In the Girls competition, Sydney Ennis had to battle her way to the finals with two close matches, before she trumped Jasmin Legge in 3.

In a combined event for U13 and U11 girls, young gun Vera Bruce topped her pool to secure the title, and Teagan Scott came in at second place. Kieran Willathgamuwa, Alex Marsh and Jacob Curry all topped their pool in the U13 Boys. Kieran eventually took out the title over his opponents.

In what could almost be classed as an upset, Cole Jerome defeated top seed Lucas Curry in the Boys U11 Final. Lucas had bagged the first two games, but Cole appeared to find some second legs and nabbed the next three.

An impromptu chess competition became a highlight of the tournament, and yes, we did see Scott Jerome fall victim to Luke Jamieson Jnrs' unmatched chess ability, and unmatched table

Chas and Joyce are both icons of our



"Rule 5: The Serve"

Two parts of the serve rule relate to the server's obligations towards the receiver.

Rule 5.6 – "After the Marker has called the score, both players must resume play without unnecessary delay. However, the server must not serve before the receiver is ready

Rule 5.10 - "A let is allowed if the receiver is not ready to return the serve and does not attempt to do so. However, if that serve is a fault, the server loses the rally."

There are two parts to this rule.

Firstly, there is an onus on the server to make sure that the receiver is in position and ready to receive the serve before attempting to serve. Quite often a player will rush back to the service box and serve in an attempt to speed up play only for the receiver not to be in position to receive the serve.

Secondly, the receiver even though they are not ready to receive should not make any attempt to hit the ball. My advice is to not even "tap" the ball back to the server. This way it cannot be construed as an attempt to hit the ball.

NEW WA JUNIOR RANKING GUIDELINES

The following guidelines outline how the WA Junior rankings will be determined for the **SWAN** each month.

Each month the Squash WA Newsletter is produced reporting on tournaments and events that happened in the previous month within Squash in WA. Within the Newsletter, we report on the WA Junior rankings and the Squash Australia Junior Rankings.

As of 1 July 2022, the SWAN will publish the SQA Junior Rankings and the WA Squash Junior rankings as per the following guidelines. These guidelines are intended to create a transparent and consistent process, so all stakeholders are clear on where and how their rankings are derived.

Squash Australia Junior Rankings

Squash Australia Junior Rankings will be taken from the SQA website National Junior Rankings (squash.org.au) https://www.squash.org.au/w/events/australian-junior-squash-tour/rankings. The top 5 Juniors in each age group will be displayed and WA players will be highlighted.

WA Squash Junior Rankings

WA Squash will take our junior rankings from SportyHQ's ranking page https://www.sportyhq.com/ranking ... insert WA Squash in the "Name contains" search facility.

All tournaments, pennants, games and matches put through SportyHQ will be included as this process needs to be as automated as possible, with as little human intervention as possible.

- Confidence scores need to be 80% or higher to be included in the rankings.
- Juniors need to be residing in WA to be included in the rankings.

Please note:

There are glitches in SportyHQ around rankings and some kids may be missing

If you believe your child is not listed and they should be or the listing is incorrect, please contact the WA Squash office so we can work together to correct the information.

Data from both SQA and WA Sporty HQ will be taken on the last weekend of each month to ensure we have as much consistency as possible.



WA MASTERS UPDATE By Janis Haswell


