2025 WA Open International Showcases World-Class Squash in Belmont

The 2025 WA Open International, held from June 4 to 8 at the WA State Squash Centre in Belmont, marked a key highlight on the PSA Challenger Tour calendar. Offering equal prize money of \$6,000 for both men's and women's divisions, the tournament drew a competitive field of international players.

In the women's final, Hong Kong's **Kirstie Yui Po Wong** faced Malaysia's Goh Zhi Xuan in a high-quality contest. Wong clinched the title with a composed and commanding performance, winning 11-4, 11-7, 7-11, 11-4. The match was a showcase of exceptional skill, sportsmanship, and tactical discipline—an excellent reflection of the spirit of the game.

The men's final, in contrast, was a far grittier affair. Second seed **Darren Pragasam** of Malaysia faced Egypt's Shady El Sherbiny in a tense and physical battle that pushed the boundaries of the rulebook. While the match lacked the elegance of the women's final, it made up for it in intensity and drama. Pragasam ultimately prevailed in four games, grinding out a hard-fought victory to secure the men's title.

The event as a whole, demonstrated the growing depth and diversity of talent on the Challenger Tour.



Northern Star - Golden Open - Kalgoorlie

The 2025 **Northern Star Golden Open** once again brought world-class squash to Kalgoorlie-Boulder from 30 May to 1 June, with over 120 competitors taking part across an impressive range of divisions at the Ray Finlayson Sporting Complex. Players travelled from across Western Australia, interstate and internationally,

making it one of the region's most significant sporting events.

The tournament featured a full Professional Squash Association (PSA) Men's and Women's draw, alongside extensive Open and graded divisions: Men's and Women's Open, Men's and Women's Masters, four separate Men's graded divisions, two Women's graded divisions, and three Junior divisions—offering opportunities for players of all ages and levels.

A standout feature of this year's tournament was its ongoing commitment to gender equality, proudly offering equal prize money for both men's and women's PSA divisions. The event also included junior clinics, providing local youth with the chance to learn directly from professional athletes.

While international stars claimed top honours in the PSA divisions, it was fantastic to see strong performances from local Kalgoorlie-Boulder and WA-based players across many of the Open, Masters, and Junior events.

More than half of the event's winners and placegetters came from WA, highlighting the depth of talent in the state and strength of the local squash community. In true Goldfields style, major division champions were also awarded signature Kalgoorlie gold nuggets, continuing the tournament's unique tradition and adding to its global appeal.

The tournament delivered strong economic benefits to the local community, with players, officials and supporters filling local hotels, restaurants, and businesses.

The Eastern Goldfields Squash Racquet Association (EGSRA) acknowledges the generous support of Northern Star Resources, local business sponsors, and the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder for making the event possible.

With strong community support and another successful year complete, planning is already underway for the 2026 Golden Open.








Coaches Corner

Nailing Tournament Preparation

With plenty of major events on the horizon, getting your preparation right is key. Speaking from personal experience here as well!

The main event for me is the Australian Masters and Trans-Tasman events coming up in early September. As much as I wish I were still in my 20s, I'm not, and with a history of a few major injuries, picking which tournaments to play and not to play is a tricky choice sometimes.

The short version is; to try and get on top of a foot problem flaring up, we booked a cortisone injection which was about a week out from the WA Open. A late call up into the PSA event fast tracked this. The result wasn't amazing, the lungs suffered, and the shot selection was a bit iffy.

Next up was the National Teams championships shortly after. What I wasn't counting on was a flare up of a different issue, resulting in a de-loaded week. I found myself moving okay but suffering late in games. Competitive to hang in there, but not strong enough to get the last few points in the match. The other part that suffered was the match hardened mindset that players need to compete. I wasn't as prepared to dig in for long enough as I normally would. A sign of lack of confidence in my conditioning played a big part in that.

Squash is a fascinating sport in that we can do lots of different activities for cross training, but nothing can replace the conditioning of body and mind that playing matches offers. During COVID I thought I was keeping fairly fit running 3-4 times per week, until I found myself having to retrain muscles on the squash court because the movements were completely different!


We saw glimpses of it with some of the juniors at the AJCs last year, you could tell those who lacked match play leading up as their decision making suffered under pressure, letting slip winnable matches as a result. This year we will try to get as many matches under their belts during September as possible to be match ready.

In my recent situation, I had undertrained. Another player at the event had overtrained. There are a number of phases in training and one key phase is the pre comp phase. This includes your heaviest workload phase - lactate tolerance and your taper phase. The lactate tolerance is maximum effort, 1:1 ratio. If you run for a minute, you get one minute rest, and if you ran hard enough, you certainly need it!



The taper phase is an opportunity for your body to recover and freshen up. From there you can then start to focus on your speed and feeling light and nimble on court. This should be taking place about 2-3 weeks out from major competition. Spend too long in a lactate phase and your body will feel fit, but you will probably feel like your feet are stuck in concrete.





Coaches Corner

For anyone preparing for the Masters in September or the Juniors in Early October, there are a few options on the calendar worth playing to make sure you get some tournament match play under your belt. Pennants is good, but you only play one match, and you get a week until your next one. Tournaments mean a match later that day or the next day. Can you get the job done or are you holding back to keep something in reserve for the next match?

So, my key take aways for this month are:

- Start thinking about your preparation for the tournament now. Can you squeeze an extra session in here or there to improve some fitness.
- Can you play a few tournaments leading up to get into a tournament frame of mind?
- Can you get some practice matches at worst case to keep the mind sharp?
- It's okay to lighten the training fitness load as you get closer to a main event. Still play your matches at high intensity, just cut back the times of your ghosting so that you get maximum rest in between each working set.

Refereeing - Let's Play Fair

with Neil Butler

The Importance of Marking

How important is it to mark the game of squash correctly?

To me, when in the role of the Referee, assisted by a Marker, I have three participants to control or look after, these being the two players and the Marker.

My workload is reduced to two if the Marker is fulfilling their role correctly.

Some people do see the significance of marking correctly, but as I have told potential candidates, as a Marker you are a *storyteller*.

Not only do you have to use the correct terminology, but you have to be *heard*.

My assessment for a good Marker is:

- · Use of correct terminology
- · Good clear voice
- · Willing to operate as part of the Referee/Marker team

The first two points are easy to achieve but the third point is the most important.

The Marker should communicate with the Referee if they are not sure if the players shot is "not up, down or out". This communication does not have to be verbal but can be a simple 'hand' gesture.

The Referee can also respond in a similar manner to the Marker, with a similar positive or unsure gesture. By doing this, the Referee/Marker team are aware of what the outcome will be if a Let is asked for at the end of the rally, on a particular shot during the rally.

The Marker has to be positive in calling situations that will stop play. If unsure, then the Marker allows the rally to continue.

Just as important is the communication with the players and spectators.

The Marker must announce the match, introduce each game, and announce the result of each game and of the match;

- must call "fault", "down", "out", "not up" or "stop", as appropriate;
- must make no call, if unsure about a serve or return;
- must call the score without delay at the end of a rally, with the server's score first, preceded by "hand out" when there is a change of server;
- must repeat the Referee's decision after a player's request for a let, and then call the score;
- must wait for the Referee's decision after a player's appeal against a Marker's call or lack of a call, and then call the score;
- must call "Game Ball" when a player needs 1 point to win a game, or "Match Ball" when a player needs 1 point to win the match;
- must call "10-all: a player must win by 2 points" when the score reaches 10 all for the first time in each game.

Examples of Marker's Calls

Match introduction:

"Smith to serve, Jones to receive, best of 5 games, love-all."

Order of calls:

Anything affecting the score (e.g. Stroke to Brown). ii)

The score with the server's score always called first. Comments on the score (e.g. Game ball). Calling the score:

- "Not up. Hand out, 4-3."
- "Yes let, 3-4."
- "Stroke to Jones, 10-8, Game Ball."
- "Fault, hand out, 8-3."
- "Not up, 10-all a player must win by 2 points."
- "10-8, Match Ball."
- "13-12. Match Ball."

End of a game:

"11–3, game to Smith. Smith leads 1 game to love."



South West Masters Teams

Busselton had winners in 3 out of 4 divisions at the South West Masters Teams event!

48 Players from the south-west and Perth competed in the 39th SW Squash Masters, in Busselton at the Sebel Resort's two courts, which started Friday afternoon through to Sunday. It was wonderful to have 10 new players in the tournament plus many long serving players.

The Tournament was played in 4 Divisions with ages from 35 to early 80s. This is the biggest master's Squash event outside of Perth and one of the longest running. Busselton had 10 players competing. This competition started in Busselton in 1987 with only 25 players and now over 620 players have competed over the past 39 years!

The coveted Division 1 shield was taken out by the appropriately named 'Top Guns' team of Greg Laurence, David Beattie and Busselton's Dave Windsor, who completed a three peat, taking the shield for the past 3 years. All players won all their matches.

Second in Division 1 was the 'Busso Beavers' team of Sean Brockman, Pete Hancock and Jason Mennell with their only loss to the eventual champs the Top Guns. Both Sean and Pete managed to get a game off their much higher ranked opponents in the last fixture of the weekend. Many of the division 1 matches were of extremely high standards, long rallies, superb vollies, amazing power and incredible touch, and at times what seemed impossible retrievals to keep the rallies going.

This was the 3rd year in a row where Warren has been part of the division 2 winning team.
